SUMMARY:

LandPaths seeks a self-motivated, energetic, and creative contractor to help facilitate Owl Camp, a four week long, nature-based day camp open to young people ages 5-13, located at Rancho Mark West in Northeast Santa Rosa, and Backcountry Basics, Intro to Backpacking, a four-day backpacking adventure in Northern Sonoma County, for teens. There may also be an opportunity to assist in LandPaths' *RiverTrek*, depending on experience.

Daily activities at Owl Camp may include storytelling, tracking, creek exploration, swimming, music, keeping a nature journal, building things from nature, nature games, learning bird calls, hiking, canoeing, exploring redwood & salmon habitat, woodworking, cooking and organic gardening. The curriculum for Backcountry Basics is geared towards teaching core backpacking skills including all aspects of Leave No Trace, cooking, setting up camp etc.

Contractor will help plan and prepare camp, lead daily activities with a group of up to 15 campers and help with post-camp administration and clean up. Contractor will have experience in many of the above activities, as well as the ability to bring other creative ideas. The ideal contractor will have experience leading youth in outdoor education settings, ample backpacking experience, a zest for life, flexibility and is seeking exciting, collaborative work in a beautiful setting.

Contractor must be current in First Aid and CPR Certifications by start of camp, able to lift and carry up to 50 lbs. and hike for long distances on uneven terrain, have a valid driver's license and clear driving record; bilingual English and Spanish preferred.
