Executive Directors Lee Hackeling and Craig Anderson are Sonoma County Conservation Council's 2024 Environmentalists of the Year

SANTA ROSA – Sonoma County Conservation Council (SCCC) has announced that Lee Hackeling, LandPaths' Executive Director of Operations and Craig Anderson, LandPaths' Executive Director of External Affairs will be presented with the *Ernestine I. Smith Environmentalist of the Year* award. In addition, Sonoma County Environmental Education Collaborative (SEEC), of which LandPaths is a participating organization and one of the original founders, is being recognized with the *Outstanding Environmental Program* for their Environmental Education Pathways initiative.

SCCC says about this year's focus, "Given that the generation that began this mission of protecting our beautiful region from rampant development is aging out, we feel that the work being done to 'foster a love of the land' for children and youth is essential to carrying on this legacy of protection and stewardship."

About the decision to award Hackeling and Anderson as environmentalists of the year, SCCC specifically mentions LandPaths' Rooting Youth in Nature initiative, calling it "vibrant environmental education programming focusing on youth and historically underserved communities."

"With vision, commitment, and amazing effectiveness, and by recognizing the importance of bringing diversity into the environmental arena, Craig and Lee have grown LandPaths into a significant force in Sonoma County," the quote continues.
